Dear Small Business Stakeholder:

When I tasked my Administration with compiling and publishing the inaugural Green Book in 2015 during my first year as Mayor, we set what can only be described looking back as a modest, yet ambitious goal: to spend \$317 million in Fiscal Year 2016 to support the District's small and local business community by connecting them to government opportunities and developing a transparent system that holds District agencies accountable for Small Business Enterprise ("SBE") participation in their procurements. Fast forward to Fiscal Year 2021 when we set a spending goal of \$917 million. Not only did we surpass that goal during the midst of a global pandemic, but I am happy to say for the first time ever, we surpassed \$1 billion in spending during FY 21. That impressive result represents an unprecedented investment in our small and local businesses and a profound, positive impact on the District's economic activity in all eight wards-I am so proud of my team and our small and local businesses!

The Green Book began as a printed volume available only upon request or in the lobbies of some of our government offices. Today, it is an all-digital publication found on a dedicated website (www.GreenBookDC.com) and it includes a comprehensive, interactive dashboard available to anyone—showcasing procurement opportunities across District government and with our regional partners such as Pepco, Washington Gas, DC Water, the Metropolitan Washington Airports Authority and the Washington Metropolitan Transit Authority. I understand how small businesses transform our city each and every day in ways both large and small. They invest in our communities, hire District residents, build generational wealth, and create new pathways to the middle class. So, I have challenged every member of my Administration to find new and innovative ways to increase SBE participation and support local businesses in every ward.

Through the release of this year's Green Book, I am reaffirming my promise and commitment to ensuring that the District's small and local businesses are able to thrive, expand, and succeed. Because we know that Washington, DC is healthy, vibrant, safe, and strong when our small and local businesses are healthy, vibrant, safe, and strong, for the first time ever, I am setting the District's SBE spending goal to exceed \$1 billion dollars. And, thanks to your help, I know we will once again meet—and exceed—our goal.

Let's keep pushing!

Since the Bowser Administration began, we have focused on the long-term success of the small and local businesses community and the residents they serve. This approach is based in our commitment to giving every Washingtonian a fair shot and to building new pathways to the middle class that increase equity across every ward.

As we grappled with the public health crisis and took the important and necessary steps that have allowed us to reopen, the Office of the Deputy Mayor for Planning and Economic Development ("DMPED") has never wavered in its commitment to empowering District Small Business Enterprises ("SBEs") through targeted programs and grant opportunities. We also made sure that we were putting vital resources into the hands of our local businesses. The goal was to emerge from the crisis ready to revitalize our economy and uplift every community, with a special focus on underserved communities.

To that end, DMPED has invested in programs that create jobs and build an entrepreneurial culture that supports small business. With the vision of continuing our District's comeback, we have excellent initiatives and grant programs available in FY22.

- The Inclusive Innovation Equity Impact Fund will support eligible businesses with training and investment in the form of revenue or equity-based financing.
- The Small Medium Business Growth Fund will target growing District businesses by support large scale capital improvements, large equipment purchasing, digital and technological enhancements to businesses.
- The D.C. Rebuild Bond Program, in which the District has teamed up with SMBX, a financial marketplace that connects small business owners with everyday investors, to offer the Rebuild Bond

Program for small businesses in D.C. to raise capital from their community. Through the Rebuild Bond Program, for a limited time, small businesses can apply to issue Small Business Bonds[™] with no origination fees. By issuing a Small Business Bond[™], you can borrow capital from existing customers at competitive rates, retain your equity, and increase customer loyalty.

- The Great Streets Retail Small Business Grant will provide qualified small businesses access to capital to improve their place of business.
- The Food Access Fund provides funding to food businesses to open new locations in Wards 7 and 8.
- The Commercial Property Acquisition Fund will help entrepreneurs and small business owners who face barriers to accessing capital to purchase their properties.

To ensure businesses are aware of the funding programs available, Mayor Bowser relaunched the #ObviouslyDC website (obviouslyDC.com) to provide companies of all scales with valuable information and resources on business recovery initiatives, as well as starting and growing a business in Washington, DC. The website is regularly updated with various funding opportunities and their corresponding launch dates.

Mayor Bowser's Fiscal Year 2022 Green Book and her Administration's procurement strategies are a critical part of the District's efforts to nurture a robust small business community. By committing to spending over a billion dollars with SBEs, we are unlocking the power that the District's procurements can have when we invest local dollars into local businesses. In turn, our local businesses will be able to unlock their power to elevate every ward and build more strong pathways to the middle class.

This year, there are a billion reasons to feel excited about the release of the Seventh Annual SBE Opportunity Guide, better known as the FY22 Green Book.

In addition to showcasing upcoming procurement opportunities with the District, the FY22 Green Book highlights the fact that District agencies spent just over \$1B with SBEs in FY21 and underscores Mayor Bowser's commitment of spending at least \$1B with SBEs this fiscal year, too.

Before Mayor Bowser assumed office, achieving such procurement spend levels with the small business community may have appeared unattainable. In today's current environment, we can see the tangible results: investments in small businesses help to drive us to build back better as the District reopens and we were able to turn our focus from surviving the economic challenges of COVID-19 to revitalizing businesses, communities, and neighborhoods in a recovery posture. So, thank you to the business community, which has shown incredible resilience throughout the public health crisis and adhered to those safety measures that protected those who live, work, and play in the District. Because of the critical role you played thus far, we can now proclaim that DC is Open.

Dear Small Business Stakeholder:

I am proud to support local small businesses and entrepreneurs as Chair of the DC Council's Committee on Business and Economic Development. The committee is responsible for matters concerning small and local business development policy. It fosters inclusive development and smart investment through thoughtful and efficient oversight and leadership of that sector. Small and local businesses are the engines of our local economy and they are vital to the District's fiscal health.

The past twenty months have been extremely challenging as you have had to innovate, pivot, and adjust to the myriad of personal and professional challenges brought upon us by the COVID-19 public health crisis. Truly shifting our local economy toward inclusive and equitable entrepreneurship is more critical than ever, not only because it is necessary, but because we have the tools and resources to do it.

The release of the seventh annual Small Business Enterprise Opportunity Guide (Green Book) represents one such tool to assist you in accessing opportunities within the District government.

To move us beyond rhetoric, we must engage in practical, effective, and sustained investments in our small business community. I have spearheaded several initiatives over the past two years that specifically target inclusive economic development. These include ensuring funding for Minority Deposit Institutions and Community Development Financial Institutions. These lending institutions are more likely to lend to small businesses and entrepreneurs of color, to take greater risks with small businesses, and to provide strong advisory services along with their capital. Making sustained investments directly in these institutions helps them to more effectively lend to our businesses. Additionally, I allocated investments toward a new Equity Fund and Commercial Acquisition Fund to provide direct access to capital to retain and grow District businesses.

Finally, I funded a disparity study that is now underway. This study will help the District move toward a true MWBE program that addresses historical and current inequities in contracting and procurement. This is a critical aspect of our approach to an inclusive economy because women and minority entrepreneurs deserve fair and tangible opportunities to share in the District's prosperity and to more equitably participate in the District's nearly \$1B procurement portfolio.

When small business succeeds, the District succeeds. We must build an equity-driven economy for our small business owners to thrive for years to come.





CMP has been in operation since 2006, earned CBE status from DSLBD in 2017, and was recertified in 2020.

I would like to take this opportunity to express how grateful we are for the relentless efforts of Director Kristi C. Whitfield and the entire DSLBD team. They guided the 2021 Project Aspire cohort (that I am very proud to have been selected as a top winner of), with the strength of a military general and compassion of a nurse. DSLBD also presented the Kiva.org business funding opportunity in great depth while articulating its benefits clearly and concisely. Director Whitfield personally reached out to a general contractor to ensure that they were complying with contract terms when we had an unforeseen delay in payment.

WHICH AGENCIES ARE INCLUDED IN THE GUIDE?

There are 89 Monitored Agencies included in this guide.

Monitored Agencies have budgets with expenditures that can be spent with SBEs and will be monitored to determine if they meet their annual SBE Spending Goal. Review the list of these agencies on pages 41 to 43, and their individual agency detail on pages 44 to 132.

Non-monitored Agencies or Funds do not have an expendable budget and are not required to participate in the D.C. Government's SBE goal-setting process.

WHAT ARE SMALL BUSNESS ENTERPRISES (SBES)?

This guide focuses on Small Business Enterprises (SBEs). SBE is a subcategory of the D.C. Government's Certified Business Enterprise (CBE) program that gives certified businesses a preference when bidding on D.C. Government contracts.

To be certified as an SBE, a business must demonstrate that they are local and receive the Local Business Enterprise (LBE) designation. Then, the business must demonstrate that it is independently owned, operated, and controlled; meets the U.S. Small Business Administration definition of a small business; and has not exceeded DSLBD thresholds for annualized gross receipts over the past three years.

1. FY22 BUDGET Details

Total Budget is the Fiscal Year 2022 (FY22) Total Appropriated Monitored Budget, which includes operating and capital dollars. FY22 begins October 1, 2021 and ends September 30, 2022. FY22 BUDGET information published in this book is current as of November 1, 2022. For the most current data, please visit **greenbookdc.com**.


Personnel & Fixed Costs are the expenditures for agency staff salaries, utilities, rent, and other fixed costs that cannot be contracted out to SBEs. These costs are not subject to the SBE spending requirement. These are also called **Automatic Exclusions**.

Expenditures that agencies proposed and DSLBD confirmed are not SBE eligible & Anticipated Transfers. This amount is also referred to as **Special** Exceptions and comprises the types of expenditures listed below. During FY21, agencies may report that some of these funds are contracts for which SBEs may apply. DSLBD will update the agency's online record at **greenbookdc.com**.

a) Anticipated Transfers are funds that one agency will transfer to another agency for services. For example, the transfer of funds from an agency to the Office of Chief Technology Officer to provide technology upgrades. b) Reasons to approve Special
Exceptions are outlined in 27 DCMR
830.6 and approved by the DSLBD
Director, which may include:

- No SBEs are available to provide the product/service due to lack of availability, interest and/or business capacity;
- Local or federal law controlling the expenditure of the funds (such as Medicaid services);
- Proprietary products/services that are owned by another entity or require special licensure (such as LexisNexis subscription service); and
- Specialized services that require specific expertise unique to a particular agency (such as biologists to support watershed restoration efforts).


c) Waivers: District Government contracts exceeding \$250,000 require a 35 percent subcontracting set-aside with SBEs. Subcontracting requirements may be waived by the Department of Small and Local Business Development (DSLBD) if an agency submits an official waiver request to DSLBD justifying why the requirement cannot be met by SBEs.



Planned Acquisitions: SBE Eligible, also referred to as an agency's **Expendable Budget**, is the amount of the agency budget remaining for purchasing products and services after subtracting the aforementioned Automatic Exclusions and Special Exceptions, and Anticipated Transfers. By law, agencies are required to spend 50 percent of their Expendable Budget with SBEs

3. FY22 SBE Spending Goal & Calculation

Annually, agencies report how they plan to spend their procurement dollars on various products and services. They update their forecasted spending plans throughout the year.

This guide highlights some of the Planned Acquisitions by category and includes the associated NIGP/commodity code. These highlighted examples may be of particular interest to SBEs because:

4. Previous Fiscal Years' SBE Spending

The SBE Spending is the total amount of funds that an agency spent with SBEs. The amounts for FY18, FY19 and FY20 are final (audited and verified).

The FY21 Preliminary SBE Spending amounts included herein are based on transactions recorded to the Office of the Chief Financial Officer's System of Accounting Record (SOAR) as of November 1, 2021. These expenditures are preliminary and unaudited, which are subject to change based on final adjustments and modifications to the District's accounting records in preparation for the District of Columbia 2021 Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR).

Agencies SBE spending amounts may vary year to year depending on several factors including:

- Priorities specific to a fiscal year;
- Overall budget increases and decreases, such as technology upgrades or other mission-critical procurements that may be funded in one fiscal year but not the next; and
- The source of the funds received may have a restricted use and is not available to SBEs.

Goals will be adjusted throughout the year based on budget changes and adjustments.

WHY DO CERTAIN DSLBD DOCUMENTS REFERENCE CBE SPENDING GOALS?


Prior to the 2014 Small and Certified Business Enterprise Development and Assistance Amendment Act, all CBEs received equal preference for District contracts and procurements. The 2014 act added priority to SBEs. Public recognition of the program has continued to follow the term CBE. While DSLBD has implemented the update in the law, rebranding of the spending goal to match the new priority will take time.

WHAT IS A CBE?

- **Procurement Preference.** CBEs are registered companies with the Department of Small and Local Business Development (DSLBD) and receive preference in District Government contracting and procurement.
- **Certification Categories.** To become certified, a business must meet the requirements of an LBE, a Local Business Enterprise, by demonstrating the business is headquartered in the District and that more than fifty percent of employees, owners, or assets or gross receipts reside in the District of Columbia.
- **Subcategory.** CBEs can apply for additional certifications to receive added preference in procurement, including Small, Disadvantaged, Resident-Owned, Longtime Resident, Enterprise Zone, Veteran-Owned, and Local Manufacturing.

WHAT IS A SBE?

- **Procurement Preference.** SBEs are a CBE subcategory. District agencies monitored by DSLBD are subject to an annual SBE spending goal requirement, and SBEs receive preference within set-aside procurements.
- Certification Requirements. To be certified as an SBE, a business must demonstrate that they are: local; independently owned, operated, and controlled; meet the U.S. Small Business Administration definition of a small business; and have not exceeded DSLBD thresholds for annualized gross receipts over the past three years.
- Agency Requirements. While agencies have SBE spending requirements, if no SBEs are available to complete work, agencies must spend with CBEs.



CONTRACTING ASSISTANCE

2. Available Assistance To Help SBEs Compete For Contract Opportunities

DSLBD's D.C. Procurement and Technical Assistance (DC PTAC) program offers free, in-depth contracting assistance to qualified D.C. businesses. Once SBEs meet DC PTAC requirements, they may work with PTAC contracting specialists to expand their business to identify and compete for local and federal contract opportunities.

Requirements: Must have a business plan, have a DUNS number, be a registered business with DCRA, and have past performance (government preferred). People often have the misconception that any business can work with PTAC, but they must meet the requirements.

DC Water's 10-year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) for water main replacement is funded at \$632 million to replace approximately 130 miles of water main and 5,827 of lead service lines. The by-block groups, when funded, will become part of the CIP.

The LSR Planning model identifies future lead service line replacements that will require a minimum of 22 miles of water main replacement.

The total planning level cost range for the CIP projects (both funded and new "byblock" unfunded projects) is \$858 million to \$1,012 million.

Potomac River Tunnel Project

WMATA has four Small and Minority Business Program opportunities that support the prosperity of the local, small business community. The Small Business Enterprise Program (SBE), the new Minority Business Enterprise Program (MBE), Small Business Program (SBP) and the Micro Business Program (MBP). WMATA is commented to its support and growth of the small business community and strives to ensure opportunities are marketed, published, and meets regulatory requirements. These programs have structured contracting requirements to facilitate competition by small and minority local business concerns, taking all reasonable steps to eliminate obstacles to their participation in procurements as prime contractors or subcontractors. The 8k series rail cars project is the first solicitation of this magnitude issued using locally funded source money. This solicitation has a small business element of 8% of the total contract value. WMATA encouraged offerors to incorporate both small and local business participation in their proposed economic benefits plans. Offerors demonstrated a good faith effort to subcontract with both small and local businesses, taking all reasonable steps to eliminate obstacles to their participation. The participation goal for both small and local businesses is 8% of total contract value.
