To Small Business Community:

As part of the Bowser Administration, we are committed to working with the small and local business community to ensure their long-term success. In order to achieve equity across all wards, we strive to give every Washingtonian a fair chance.

With a focus on empowering District Small Business Enterprises ("SBEs") through targeted programs and grant opportunities, the Office of the Deputy Mayor for Planning and Economic Development ("DMPED") has never wavered in its commitment to supporting the business community within the District. In addition, we made sure that local businesses were receiving vital resources. Our goal is to uplift underserved communities and revitalize our local economy.

To achieve these goals, DMPED has invested in programs that create jobs and build an entrepreneurial culture supporting small businesses. With the vision of continuing to build back a better DC, we have high-impact initiatives and grant programs available in FY23. Examples:

- The Inclusive Innovation Equity Impact Fund supports eligible businesses with training and investment in the form of revenue or equity-based financing.
- The Small Medium Business Growth Fund targets growing District businesses by supporting capital improvements, large equipment purchasing, and digital and technological enhancements to businesses.

- The D.C. Rebuild Bond Program, in which the District has teamed up with SMBX, a financial marketplace that connects small business owners with everyday investors, helps small businesses in D.C. raise capital from their community.
- The Great Streets Retail Small Business Grant provides qualified small businesses access to capital to improve their place of business.
- The Food Access Fund was created to help food businesses to open new locations, primarily in Wards 7 and 8.
- The Commercial Property Acquisition Fund helps entrepreneurs and small business owners who face barriers to accessing capital to purchase properties.

In order to make sure businesses are aware of the funding programs available, Mayor Bowser has continued to promote ObviouslyDC.com as a resource for information and resources about business recovery programs, as well as how to begin and grow a business in Washington, D.C.

We look forward to continuing to support small businesses in Washington, D.C.

Having passed the \$1.1 billion mark in SBE spending in 2021, there are now more than a billion reasons to celebrate the release of the eighth Annual SBE Opportunity Guide, also known as the D.C. Green Book.

As well as highlighting upcoming procurement opportunities with the District, the FY23 Green Book highlights the District's \$1.1 billion spend with SBEs in FY22 and Mayor Bowser's commitment to spend over \$1 billion with SBEs in FY23. I am proud to support local small businesses and entrepreneurs as Chair of the D.C. Council's Committee on Business and Economic Development. The Committee is responsible for matters concerning small and local business development policy and fosters inclusive development and smart investment through thoughtful and efficient oversight and leadership of that sector. Small and local businesses are the engines of our local economy and vital to the District's fiscal health.

The release of the eighth annual Small Business Enterprise Opportunity Guide (Green Book) represents one tool to assist you in accessing opportunities within the District government. 

My name is Kenyon Walker, CEO of Zero Waste Services based in Ward 7. Zero Waste Services provides ecofriendly solid waste disposal and recycling services to residential, commercial, and industrial customers. We haul and dispose of municipal solid waste (household), commingled recycling, dirt, rubble, stone, and demolition debris. We are the only resident-owned, CBE, licensed solid waste and disposal business in Ward 7.

This past year, the DSBLD team has supported our growth by connecting us with opportunities in the District and beyond. This has been achieved via workshops, networking events, and, most importantly, direct communication with team members for assistance when needed. Moreover, the Greenbook helps to keep us aware of potential contracting and procurement for agencies and industries.

As a community partner, Zero Waste Services is committed to keeping the city streets and alleyways free of garbage and debris with our garbage trucks and industrial equipment. Our partnerships with construction firms and local governments support economic development and job creation initiatives across all Wards. Many of our team members are born and raised in the District of Columbia. More importantly, our projects positively impact lives, communities, and livelihoods in the District. This includes trash collection services for schools, libraries, shelters, and DPW facilities in partnership with DGS.

Big thanks to all of our agency partners who believe so strongly in local businesses like ours! And a huge thank you to Kristi Whitfield for her forward-thinking leadership and the staff of DSLBD for working tirelessly to ensure that fair opportunities exist for District businesses to thrive. We are excited and look forward to future collaborative opportunities with the DSLBD team.

We have operated TCG Property Care Inc., a commercial landscaping company, for five years, and DSLBD has played a very significant role in our development. Through this agency, we have not only become a Certified Business Enterprise (CBE), but we have received overwhelming support from them as well. We have been awarded several grants from them throughout the years, received invaluable assistance through their Procurement Technical Assistant Program, completed various trainings that they have coordinated, and have formed valuable relationships with individuals we have met through some of their networking functions. Additionally, the CBE designation has been the catalyst for many of the relationships we now have with various general contractors throughout the city. The CBE designation is a serious asset, and it is one of the main reasons for our success here in the District.

As the founding principal of Salvi Associates, I can attest that the CBE designation has proven to be an invaluable help to our firm. DSLBD has offered access to resources that would have otherwise been unavailable for a small business owner and a startup design company. DSLBD has also opened connections to a network of like-minded professionals and business owners committed to building businesses in DC.

During the pandemic, like every other small business in the District, we needed support, and in 2022, DSLBD awarded us the CBE Equity Impact Enterprise Grant.

Mayor Bowser's enforcement of the rules regarding small business participation in all DC government contracts has also contributed to my and other small businesses' success. Because of her efforts to keep dollars local, Salvi Associates were recently awarded a contract to provide design services for the new Ward 8 Senior Wellness Center as Associate Architect with Perkins Eastman DC. We are also actively pursuing additional work in DC as a team to build on that success.

We are also excited to announce that some of the other prime contractors the company works with are now considering our services for work beyond DC's CBE program.

In that sense, the CBE program has played the role of an incubator. Being a CBE offers small businesses the opportunity to showcase their products or services and provide a platform to grow from.

Chad O'L Public Relations and Events, LLC became a CBE (Certified Business Enterprise) in 2018 through DSLBD (Department of Small and Local Business Development) and attended their free ongoing networking events, procurement fairs, and workshops tailored specifically for DC's small and minority businesses to support growth, such as an in-depth guide on how to do business with the DC Government offered by one of their community's agency partners, the Procurement Technical Assistance Center (PTAC). Because of these unique DC Government programs and opportunities, Chad O'L Public Relations and Events, LLC was able to do a significant company rebrand to a full-service marketing firm in 2021, with a specific focus on a comprehensive suite of brand and digital marketing services. Embracing the digital world was a critical growth metric for the company's stability, bringing state-of-the-art solutions using a high-tech team of methodical thinkers, content creators, and innovative technologists who are fully integrated into the latest innovations and technology – digital is our native language. Becoming fully immersed in our government and corporate client's business industry, coupled with leveraging best practices learned from industries across the globe, Chad O'L Public Relations and Events, LLC can understand and capture your agency's vision to accomplish goals.

Since our CBE Certification, we have secured two contracts on the DCSS (DC Supply Schedule), one contract in federal contracting space and doing business in 14 US States and four international countries utilizing the Export-Import Bank of the United States credit insurance policy, and were awarded the first ever CBE Equity Impact Enterprise grant. As part of our five years growth plan, we plan to secure a commercial space in the District that will house our e-commerce fulfillment center, site O'L Lifestyles Brands, creating jobs and hiring locals for open positions.

Over the years it has been such a pleasure building a relationship with Director Kristi Whitfield and the phenomenal hard-working DSLBD team; they are genuinely there to help. The intentional and strategic events like DC Connect, CBE Industry Rally, Ward 7 & 8 Networking, and the PTAC 2022 Conference and Matchmaker have helped me learn more about how to position my business for success and enlarge my DC business circle to develop meaningful relationships.

Additionally, AMC was an inaugural recipient of the Equity Impact Enterprise grant. The grant helped with several operating costs incurred throughout the year. AMC is a subcontractor with MedStar Family Choice, under a contract with DC Healthcare Finance, to provide graphic design, 508 remediation services, and communications support.

The future is bright! I am confident and hopeful that I will continue to receive support to continue to scale my business because, as a small business, we experience the #fairshot promised by Mayor Bowser.

Dixon's Pest Control, Inc., a small, long-time resident and family-owned business in the District of Columbia, is proud to be part of the Certified Business Enterprise Program with the District's Department of Small and Local Business Development. In addition to keeping us abreast and making us aware of business opportunities, our participation in the program enables our background qualification and capabilities to be readily presented and accessible to all of the District of Columbia Contracting Agencies and others in need of professional pest control services.

Also, in addition to having benefitted from the DSLBD's guidance and counseling resources, Dixon's Pest Control is an elated recipient of a CBE Equity Impact Enterprise Grant. Needless to say, the Grant was awarded to us at the most appropriate time, on the heels of COVID-19. And needless to say, it allowed us to bring a good amount of our liabilities current.

We appreciate having an agency that is committed to the success of local small businesses and hope other small businesses, especially newly started businesses, will become participants. The DSLBD's Staff is very courteous and professional and will make every effort to empower and assist others in understanding and taking advantage of opportunities available to them.

My very first involvement with DSLBD was at a contractor fair at the Convention Center nearly 20 years ago, where I met Alice Patterson, a representative of Clark Construction, at their vendor table. As a newly CBE-certified photographer, my pulse raced as I showed her my portfolio. I don't remember what I said, but I will never forget her judicious silence and then her response— "We have some work that needs to be done, and I think you can do it." That conversation eventually led to our first contract with Clark, taking monthly progress photos for the construction of the United States Department of Transportation Headquarters at the Navy Yard. That contract enabled me to pay enough of my bills to quit my job and focus on photography full-time. Since then, we have blossomed and grown in many ways.

Over the years, our CBE status qualified us to successfully bid on other contracts, including photographing the construction of Nationals' Stadium and Target/DCUSA and becoming a contract photographer for Events DC, which resulted in assignments to shoot multiple Cherry Blossom parades, concerts at RFK Stadium, and two inaugurations—experiences I will never forget. Though not typically mentioned when discussing government contracting, photography is a service used by nearly every agency in the government and its partners. We have captured images and videos for so many great agencies, including DC Public Schools, the Office of the Deputy Mayor for Planning and Economic Development, the Mayor's Office on Asian and Pacific Islander Affairs, Office of the Attorney General. Our images can be seen all over on bus ads, campaign posters, websites, and magazines. We're currently working as contract photographers for DC Public Libraries, Friendship Charter Schools, and Washington DC Economic Partnership — capturing economic development in 50+ city neighborhoods for their annual publications.

Though a CBE license alone has not been the sole key to our success, having our CBE license has been like a passport to all Washington has to offer and has given me opportunities to personally take part in the dynamic growth that has taken place all over DC—the city where I was born and raised. I'm very grateful to DSLBD for that. It gives me immense pride to drive around with my daughter and point at places and say, "we did photos for that, we were a part of that". My mission at this point is to be able to pass that opportunity on to her and other young photographers around the city.

We all deserve to feel pride in and part of this city we call "ours."

AMAR Group, LLC is an architecture, engineering, and inspection company that has been in business since 1991, and I believe sustaining a business takes a village – and great faith. And that's even more true during a pandemic. Like most local enterprises, the pandemic placed extra stress on our business and staff. District programs and grants provided by DSLBD available to certified business enterprises allowed AMAR Group to survive the pandemic. Through an initiative funded by the District of Columbia, AMAR Group received coaching and training from the Coalition for Nonprofit Housing and Economic Development that recently resulted in contracts earned. And this past year, we received and were awarded an Equity Impact Enterprise Grant, which was able to assist in paying bills. And after renting for 24 years, the Commercial Property Acquisition Fund (through the Deputy Mayor for Planning and Economic Development) provided us with down payment assistance to purchase office space. I was able to sign a contract in February, settle in April, then renovate and move into our office in May. So, when I say it takes a village, I mean it. So having a wonderful staff, great family, supportive community, government, and an exceptional God is my village, and I am running with the horses!

Foundation Entertainment, LLC (FEAV) has been a Certified Business Entity (CBE) for approximately three years, and I cannot speak highly enough about the opportunities, resources, guidance, and support that I have received in working with the District government. From the beginning, agencies like DSLBD, DCRA, and DCOTR have done a fantastic job in charting a path to help small and local companies successfully do business in DC. Since obtaining my CBE status, I have been able to access an incredible array of resources, such as the Procurement Technical Assistance Center (PTAC) and a wide variety of classes, webinars, workshops, and events that have not only offered ongoing, tailored training, and guidance but also provided opportunities to meet directly with potential DC government clients. - Consider whether to expand a business to compete for contracts that request products/services similar to its current business model;
- Connect with free, in-depth contracting assistance to help small and local businesses build their capacity to compete effectively for D.C. Government contracts.

WHICH AGENCIES ARE INCLUDED IN THE GUIDE?

There are 90 Monitored Agencies included in this guide.

Monitored Agencies have budgets with expenditures that can be spent with SBEs and will be monitored to determine if they meet their annual SBE Spending Goal. Review the list of these agencies on pages 38 to 40, and their individual agency detail on pages 41 to 130.

Non-monitored Agencies or Funds do not have an expendable budget and are not required to participate in the D.C. Government's SBE goal-setting process.

WHAT ARE SMALL BUSNESS ENTERPRISES (SBES)?

This guide focuses on Small Business Enterprises (SBEs). SBE is a subcategory of the D.C. Government's Certified Business Enterprise (CBE) program that gives certified businesses a preference when bidding on D.C. Government contracts.

To be certified as an SBE, a business must demonstrate that they are local and receive the Local Business Enterprise (LBE) designation. Then, the business must demonstrate that it is independently owned, operated, and controlled; meets the U.S. Small Business Administration definition of a small business; and has not exceeded DSLBD thresholds for annualized gross receipts over the past three years.

1. FY23 BUDGET DETAILS

Total Budget is the Fiscal Year 2023 (FY23) Total Appropriated Monitored Budget, which includes operating and capital dollars. FY23 begins October 1, 2022 and ends September 30, 2023. FY23 BUDGET information published in this book is current as of December 1, 2022. For the most current data, please visit **greenbookdc.com**.

Personnel & Fixed Costs are the expenditures for agency staff salaries, utilities, rent, and other fixed costs that cannot be contracted out to SBEs. These costs are not subject to the SBE spending requirement. These are also called Automatic Exclusions.


Expenditures that agencies proposed and DSLBD confirmed are not SBE eligible & Anticipated Transfers. This amount is also referred to as Special Exceptions and comprises the types of expenditures listed below. During FY23, agencies may report that some of these funds are contracts for which SBEs may apply. DSLBD will update the agency's online record at

greenbookdc.com.

a) Anticipated Transfers are funds that one agency will transfer to another agency for services. For example, the transfer of funds from an agency to the Office of Chief Technology Officer to provide technology upgrades.

b) Reasons to approve Special
Exceptions are outlined in 27 DCMR
830.6 and approved by the DSLBD
Director, which may include:

- No SBEs are available to provide the product/service due to lack of availability, interest and/or business capacity;
- Local or federal law controlling the expenditure of the funds (such as Medicaid services);
- Proprietary products/services that are owned by another entity or require special licensure (such as LexisNexis subscription service); and
- Specialized services that require specific expertise unique to a particular agency (such as biologists to support watershed restoration efforts).
- c) Waivers: District Government contracts exceeding \$250,000 require a 35 percent subcontracting set-aside with SBEs. Subcontracting requirements may be waived by the Department of Small and Local Business Development (DSLBD) if an agency submits an official waiver request to DSLBD justifying why the requirement cannot be met by SBEs.




Planned Acquisitions: SBE Eligible, also referred to as an agency's Expendable Budget, is the amount of the agency budget remaining for purchasing products and services after subtracting the aforementioned Automatic Exclusions and Special Exceptions, and Anticipated Transfers. By law, agencies are required to spend 50 percent of their Expendable Budget with SBEs

2. FY23 SBE SPENDING GOAL & CALCULATION

The FY23 SBE Spending Goal is the minimum amount that each D.C. government agency is required to spend with SBEs between October 1, 2022 and September 30, 2023. The goal is set by dividing the Expendable Budget in half (50%). Goals will be adjusted throughout the year based on budget changes and adjustments (ADJUSTED GOAL).

3. FY23 SBE SPENDING GOAL & CALCULATION

Annually, agencies report how they plan to spend their procurement dollars on various products and services. They update their forecasted spending plans throughout the year.

This guide highlights some of the Planned Acquisitions by category and includes the associated NIGP/commodity code. These highlighted examples may be of particular interest to SBEs because:

- in the past agencies indicated they could not find SBEs for the product/service; or
- these are products/services that SBEs could provide directly, via subcontracting with primes, teaming with other CBEs and/ or building the business' capacity.

4. PREVIOUS FISCAL YEARS' SBE SPENDING

The SBE Spending is the total amount of funds that an agency spent with SBEs. The amounts for FY18, FY19, FY20, and FY21 are final (audited and verified).

The FY22 Preliminary SBE Spending amounts included herein are based on transactions recorded to the Office of the Chief Financial Officer's System of Accounting Record (SOAR) as of November 2022. These expenditures are preliminary and unaudited, which are subject to change based on final adjustments and modifications to the District's accounting records in preparation for the District of Columbia 2021 Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR).

Agencies SBE spending amounts may vary year to year depending on several factors including:

- Priorities specific to a fiscal year;
- Overall budget increases and decreases, such as technology upgrades or other mission-critical procurements that may be funded in one fiscal year but not the next; and
- The source of the funds received may have a restricted use and is not available to SBEs.

Goals will be adjusted throughout the year based on budget changes and adjustments.

WHY DO CERTAIN DSLBD DOCUMENTS REFERENCE CBE SPENDING GOALS?


Prior to the 2014 Small and Certified Business Enterprise Development and Assistance Amendment Act, all CBEs received equal preference for District contracts and procurements. The 2014 act added priority to SBEs. Public recognition of the program has continued to follow the term CBE. While DSLBD has implemented the update in the law, rebranding of the spending goal to match the new priority will take time.

WHAT IS A CBE?

- Procurement Preference. CBEs are registered companies with the Department of Small and Local Business Development (DSLBD) and receive preference in District Government contracting and procurement.
- Certification Categories. To become certified, a business must meet the requirements of an LBE, a Local Business Enterprise, by demonstrating the business is headquartered in the District and that more than fifty percent of employees, owners, assets or gross receipts reside in the District of Columbia.
- Subcategory. CBEs can apply for additional certifications to receive added preference in procurement, including Small, Disadvantaged, Resident-Owned, Longtime Resident, Enterprise Zone, Veteran-Owned, and Local Manufacturing.

WHAT IS A SBE?

- Procurement Preference. SBEs are a CBE subcategory.
 District agencies monitored by DSLBD are subject to an
 annual SBE spending goal requirement, and SBEs receive
 preference within set-aside procurements.
- Certification Requirements. To be certified as an SBE, a business must demonstrate that they are: local; independently owned, operated, and controlled; meet the U.S. Small Business Administration definition of a small business; and have not exceeded DSLBD thresholds for annualized gross receipts over the past three years.
- Agency Requirements. While agencies have SBE spending requirements, if no SBEs are available to complete work, agencies must spend with CBEs.



CONTRACTING ASSISTANCE

DSLBD's D.C. Procurement and Technical Assistance (DC PTAC) program offers free, in-depth contracting assistance to qualified D.C. businesses. Once SBEs meet DC PTAC requirements, they may work with PTAC contracting specialists to expand their business to identify and compete for local and federal contract opportunities.

Requirements: Must have a business plan, have a DUNS number, be a registered business with DCLP, and have past performance (government preferred). People often have the misconception that any business can work with PTAC, but they must meet the requirements.

DC Water's 10-year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) for water main replacement is funded at \$632 million to replace approximately 130 miles of water main and 5,827 miles of lead service lines. The byblock groups, when funded, will become part of the CIP.

The LSR Planning model identifies future lead service line replacements that will require a minimum of 22 miles of water main replacement.

The total planning level cost range for the CIP projects (both funded and new "by-block" unfunded projects) is \$858 million to \$1,012 billion.

The Metropolitan Washington Airports Authority (Airports Authority) manages four key entities: Ronald Reagan Washington National Airport, Washington Dulles International Airport, the Dulles Toll Road, and construction of Metrorail Silver Line expansion to Dulles Airport and beyond through the Dulles Corridor Metrorail Project. The Airports Authority provides world-class travel options and plays a key role in generating new business, creating jobs to support the local economy, boosting economic development through supplier diversity, and promoting tourism. Additionally, the Airports Authority, through its business enterprises, contractors, and dependent industries, provides or supports nearly 400,000 jobs across the region, more than 100,000 of which are based in the District of Columbia, generating more than \$4.5 billion in annual labor income. Regionally, jobs provided or supported by the Airports Authority account for approximately \$15 billion in annual labor income, approximately \$3 billion in state and local taxes, and nearly \$21 billion in business revenue. Through the Office for Diversity, Inclusion and

Social Impact, the Airports Authority encourages the participation of DC-based businesses in its contracting opportunities by engaging in various strategic events, supplier development programs, and partnerships throughout the DC metropolitan area to promote the Airports Authority's Small Business Programs, and ultimately increase DC-based firms' participation in Airports Authority procurement opportunities. The Airports Authority LDBE Program provides opportunities to local small business firms without regard to race or sex. These LDBE firms are eligible for any Authority contract that requires LDBE participation. An LDBE is defined as a small business concern, which is organized for profit and located within a 100-mile radius of Washington DC's Zero Mile Marker. The average annual gross receipts, based on the firm's last three years of receipts, must not exceed the small business size standard established by the Authority for the services or goods that will be provided in an Authority contract. The receipts of all affiliates are counted in determining size.

The DC PLUG initiative is a partnership between the District and Pepco to improve the reliability and resiliency of the District of Columbia energy grid by placing select feeders underground in Wards 3, 4, 5, 7, and 8.
