



Update on Department of Small and Local Business Development (DSLBD) Operating Status during COVID-19 Emergency

NOTICE: The Public Health Emergency is now in effect through April 24; school and government reopen on April 27.

What is our operating status?

Along with the rest of District government, our agency remains operational. We are operating on a telework status and have made some modifications to how services are being provided which are listed below.

How does this impact what we do?

- **Certified Business Enterprise Program** – modified service. We will continue to review new applications and accept applications. No site visits will take place during the public health emergency.
- **DC Procurement Technical Assistance Center** – modified service. We will continue to review existing client information/cases and accept new clients. No in-person meetings will take place during the public health emergency.
- **DC Main Street Program** – no changes. We will continue to work with and support the businesses located in the District commercial corridors.
- **DC Clean Teams** – no changes. We will continue to maintain and keep District commercial corridors clean.
- **Business Trainings & Workshops** – suspended. No in-person trainings and workshops will take place during the public health emergency.
- **Compliance & Enforcement** – modified service. We will continue to collect, review and monitor all compliance-related documents from beneficiaries of District-funded projects. No spot checks will take place during the public health emergency.

How does this impact our physical locations?

- **DSLBD Headquarters** – closed during the public health emergency.

- DSLBD will continue to communicate with stakeholders via dslbd.dc.gov and social media including Twitter (@SmallBizDC) and Instagram (@SmallBizDC).

What precautions are we taking to limit the spread of the coronavirus (COVID-19)?
