## LOCAL LEADERS COLLABORATE TO CATALYZE INNOVATION AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP EAST OF THE RIVER

(Washington, D.C.) – Georgetown University's Global Social Enterprise Initiative (GSEI) and the DC Department of Small and Local Business Development (DSLBD) partnered to host Venture DC: Engaging Diverse Changemakers, a collaborative event held Friday, July 31st and Saturday, August 1st with the purpose of supporting innovation and entrepreneurship in the nation's capital.

With the two day event, held at the RISE Demonstration Center in Ward 8, DC leaders encouraged and empowered emerging entrepreneurs in the District to investigate ways to use technology and innovation to solve some of DC's most pressing challenges related to health care, education, housing, economic security, and access to financial services, specifically in Wards 7 and 8.
