Request for Applications (RFA) FY20 DC Main Streets Market Analyses

The Department of Small and Local Business Development (DSLBD) is soliciting applications from eligible applicants to conduct market analyses for the following DC Main Streets Programs:

- Upper Bladensburg
- Glover Park
- Cleveland Park

- Logan Circle
- U Street
- Upper Georgia Avenue

The grant award is \$64,500. The grant period of performance is December 1, 2019 through May 30, 2020.

Purpose of Grant

The purpose of this grant is to conduct market analyses for new DC Main Streets Programs. The final deliverables will be utilized by the programs listed above to retain, expand, and attract neighborhood-serving retail stores. Additionally, those deliverables will be utilized to unify and strengthen the commercial corridor.

Eligibility Information

Applications that do not meet these above requirements <u>will not be scored</u>. Applicants <u>MUST</u> submit these completed documents through their online application by the deadline.

November 21, 2019 (at noon)	Application Deadline. Late applications are not accepted.
December 10, 2019	Awards announced. Anticipated date to notify applicants whether they have been awarded a grant. Additional documents may be required from awardee. DLSBD reserves the right to withdraw an award if the Selected Applicant does not submit the requested documents.

Grant Information

Grantee will conduct a market analysis for the six aforementioned DC Main Streets Programs, resulting in six separate market analyses.

How to Apply

To start an application, interested applicants must first register at https://octo.quickbase.com/db/bp25n4nyr DSLBD will activate applicants' online access within **one (1) business day** and notify them via email. The email will contain instructions on how to access the online application. Please submit only one registration form for your organization. By requesting an application, your organization is NOT obligated to apply.

Applications must be made through the online portal. DSLBD will not accept applications submitted via hand delivery, mail, or courier service. Late submissions and incomplete applications will not be reviewed.

DSLBD shall not be liable for any costs incurred in the preparation of applications in response to the RFA. Applicant agrees that all costs incurred in developing the application are the applicant's sole responsibility.

Application Questions

- Provide a brief history of your company and your experience with market analysis (500 character limit).
- Upload a sample of past market analysis conducted within the last three years (2016-2019).
- Provide a timeline for this project (500 character limit).
- Upload resume(s) for principal(s) who will work on this project. (Upload the resumes in one .pdf file.)
- Provide a description of your understanding and experience with the Main Streets model (750 character limit).

Application Scoring

DSLBD will select a grant recipient through a competitive application process. Applicants, who best demonstrate that they are qualified to achieve the program's objectives will be awarded the grant. A review panel will review the applications received by the submission deadline and score them against the following criteria with respective weight:

- 1. History of organization to complete the work requested. Previous projects and the experience of team leaders will show that the applicant possesses the expertise to complete the grant successfully. (10 points)
- 2. Sample of Market Analysis. A clearly-presented market analysis that is easy to read and understand. (10 points)
- **3. Timeline of Project**. The ability of the applicant to produce the market analyses in a timely manner, following a realistic project plan. (10 points)
- **4. Resume of principals/staff.** Resumes that demonstrate ability to produce this work. (5 points)
- 5. Experience with the Main Streets model. Clearly demonstrates understanding of the Main Streets model as a commercial revitalization tool and the information required in a market analysis to support that model. Demonstrated experience with the National Main Streets Center and conducting market analyses with other Main Streets Programs. (15 points)

Reservations

Funding for any grant award is contingent on continued grantor funding. The publication of Request for Applications does not commit DSLBD to make any awards.

DSLBD reserves the right to issue addenda, amendments, or a rescission subsequent to the issuance of the NOFA or RFA. Funding for this award is contingent on continued funding from the grantor. The RFA does not commit DSLBD to make an award.

Applications that do not comply with the application instructions will not be considered. DSLBD reserves the right to accept or deny any or all applications if DSLBD determines that is in the best interest. DSLBD shall notify the applicant if it rejects that applicant's proposal. DSLBD may suspend or terminate an outstanding RFA pursuant to its own grantmaking rule(s) or any applicable federal regulation or requirement.

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DSLBD reserves the right to accept or deny any or all applications if DSLBD determines that is in the best interest of the District to do so.

DSLBD shall not be liable for any costs incurred by an applicant in the preparation of one or more grant applications for this Program. The applicant understands and agrees that all costs incurred in developing and preparing any grant application shall be the applicant's sole responsibility.

DSLBD may conduct pre-award on-site visits to verify information submitted in a grant application.

DSLBD serves as its own reference in evaluating applications. Applicants' performance in managing previous grants will be factored into grant decisions.

DSLBD may enter into negotiations with an awardee and adopt a firm funding amount or other revision of the awardee's proposal that may result from the negotiations.

In the event of a conflict between the terms and conditions of the grant application and any applicable federal or local law or regulation, or any ambiguity related thereto, then the provisions of the applicable law or regulation shall control and it shall be the responsibility of the applicant to ensure compliance.
